Class Updates...

Year R Bumble Bees



Bumble bees have been coming to school part time and have been resting in the afternoons while Clare Ross and Jeannette Hunter made Home Visits. Thank you for welcoming our staff into their homes, which we have found invaluable in starting to get to know the children and to starting to build relationships with you all.

We have been finding out about the zones in the classroom and our outside environment. We really love the new play trail! We have been meeting new friends and getting to know them in our family Groups. We have met all of our adult leaders and by the time you read this we will have had our first lunch in school!

What is going on in Bumble Bees during this term?

The children will be learning about 'Ourselves' but within the context of 'Super Bees'. This will give us an opportunity to find out what each of us is Super Good at. We will also find out about other superheroes both real and imaginary.

Year 1 Ladybirds



Ladybirds have been focused at the start of term on the Hook event for their "Animal Kingdom" project. As you are probably aware they have had a Special Delivery which turned out to be a range of cuddly toy animals.

They have also discussed and organised classroom routines and agreed a Class Charter which is displayed in their room.

What will Ladybirds be learning during this term?

The pupils will be exploring different types of animals during this term and deciding which animals might be suitable to keep on a farm, a zoo, at home or even in school. Towards the end of the project they will be creating their own class zoo, taking on the role of zoo tour guides and inviting Butterflies class and then parents to come on a visit.

In English the pupils will be exploring traditional tales and the picture book "Dear Zoo". They will be writing letters to persuade myself to allow a school pet, and another letter to persuade someone to visit either: England, Scotland, Wales or Northern Island as part of their geographical "United Kingdom" project.

In Maths the pupils will be developing their adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing skills and their understanding of place value. They will be undertaking a range of problem solving, learn more about shapes and fractions and develop their understanding of position and movement of shapes on grids.



Year 2/3 Butterflies

Butterflies have been sharing their summer holiday experiences of travelling to different places in the world. They have also been starting to learn about the continents and oceans on Earth as part of their "Where in the World" project. They have also discussed and agreed classroom routines, devised an agreed set of class rules and created guidelines for all children for the use of the new Trim Trail.

What will Butterflies be learning during this term?

They will link this work to trying different foods from around the world and towards the end of the project will be creating information posters for a supermarket to inform customers about foods from different places in the world.

In English the pupils will be exploring narratives about personal experience. They will be writing letters to parents giving information about our Harvest celebration and collection of food items, as well as writing a review of our Harvest celebration for the website. They will also be producing a narrative about a modern day fairy.

In maths the pupils will be developing their mental and written skills and strategies for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. They will also be using and applying these skills and their knowledge of other aspects of maths in a range of problems solving activities.

Hopes

In the first Collective Worship of the term I shared my hopes for us all as a school for this year with the pupils in Ladybirds and Butterflies classes. Some of my key hopes were:

*"I hope that we all Love and Hope.
I hope that we all learn and grow.
I hope that we are all kind and caring.
I hope that we all follow the Golden Rules".*

We also discussed the use of a dove as a symbol of peace and hope. The pupils have since been busy thinking about and writing their own hopes for the school year on paper doves which will be displayed in the school. Below are some of their thoughts:

*"I hope that we all stay friends
I hope that we try new things
I hope that we all share and care
I hope we listen to everyone."*

Collective Worship themes

During the rest of this half-term we will be exploring the themes of: Worship, Harvest and Teaching and Learning with the children. Each theme will be explored over a fortnight and through a range of whole school, class and singing Collective Worship. The children will also benefit from visitors like Reverend Philippa Mills discussing the themes with them as well.

Church School Values

As you are aware the school's Values statement is:

"Building our Community with Love and Hope"

The school staff and governors created this statement at the start of last academic year. We are very keen to explore these Values further and consult with both the children and yourselves to ensure that the Values we promote as a school are understood and supported by all members of our school community.

The range of events that were organised last year and the funds that were raised to enhance the children's experience at Cornerstone were stunning. I would strongly encourage new parents to join this group, as a fantastic way of supporting your child's education but also a fantastic way of meeting other parents and having fun.

Home Learning

The primary school years are crucial for children's education. They develop key skills, learn crucial knowledge and develop learning attributes like creativity, questioning, logical thinking, embracing challenge and perseverance.

An important part of this learning journey for your child takes place through our home-school partnership and the time and support you give your child with their home learning.

There will be a range of tasks sent home over the course of the year to enhance your child's understanding and I would passionately encourage you to be as involved as you can. We appreciate that everybody has busy lives and it is not always easy to find time. However every time you can support your child's learning, it is time well spent. Home Learning for all classes will be given out on Thursdays and collected in by the following Wednesday.

One of the most valuable things any parent can do is to encourage a daily reading habit and a love of reading. This can include practising key words or sounds, hearing your child read and reading to them. Educational research consistently demonstrates how valuable a daily ten minutes time slot spent reading is for a child's education, not just at primary school but also for their future.

Performing Arts Club

Thank you to Mandy Quick who is running this club again this year on Mondays after school. This term it will culminate in performances of a short musical called "Billy No Buzz" on Wednesday 19th November (at 2 pm and 6 pm).

Gardening Club

Also thank you to Clare Ross who is running this club as she did last academic year. The club will be starting in October and will take place on Thursdays after school for pupils in Years 1, 2 and 3.

WOW writing

Wonderful Outstanding Writing that makes a reader go WOW!

This is a new initiative we are introducing this year to help promote the importance and reason for writing for all the children. The aim is to help them more fully understand that this is an invaluable way of communicating with other people.

We are developing a display board to showcase excellent writing throughout the year and if your child's work is displayed they will also receive a new WOW certificate in Celebration Worship on Fridays. Visitors to our school, including yourselves, will be asked to contribute as well by using post-its which will be available to leave a message to say what they liked about a particular piece of writing. This should help the children appreciate that writing is still a two-way interactive process with a reader.

Messy Church in Whiteley

It has been lovely to see children and families from Cornerstone enjoying some of the previous Messy Church afternoons held in the Community Centre on the first Sunday of every month. The session begins at 4 pm and finishes by 6 pm.

There are always a range of fun activities based around a theme, Reverend Philippa then shares a story and leads the children in singing a couple of songs. The afternoons conclude with the families sharing a tea of bread, cheese, cucumber, carrots and cake!
